

August 6 and August 9 mark the **80th** anniversaries of the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki which ushered in the nuclear age. Humanity has lived under the threat of **omnicide**, the destruction of all life, ever since.

Historians can only estimate the number of people predominantly civilians killed by the atomic bomb blasts and by radiation sickness and cancer afterwards; it could be higher than 300,000.
